	6th Battalion Aust. Inf.	5564	Driver Ernest JENNINGS, M.M.	For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty on the 23rd day of August 1918 near HERLEVILLE Wood. This Driver who was attached to Brigade Headquarters was detailed to cart water <del>and</del> and ammunition to the troops holding the most advanced positions. All roads behind the line were being swept by extremely heavy enemy shell fire, so Driver JENNINGS at great personal risk under a veritable hail of Machine Gun and rifle bullets rushed his limbered wagon out over the open country across the deep ravine, the sides of which were almost precipitous and lined with enemy dugouts and wire. This driver was working alone and could not leave his horses to pick a route, nevertheless he made three such trips successfully and delivered the water and ammunition when it was much needed. His courage and daring was of the highest order. On one occasion his limber overturned and only by his skilful horsemanship did he prevent his wagon and horses from crashing down into the ravine.
