Driver Ernest JENNINGS.	<p>Not Recommended in connection with Birthday Honours Gazette.</p> <p>For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty at STRAZZELLE on the night of 24th/25th April, 1918. Driver JENNINGS was in charge of a limber conveying hot rations to the front line troops. The village through which he had to pass was burning fiercely and the enemy suddenly opened heavy artillery fire on the road. The limber was struck several times by fragments and part of the rations knocked off. Dvr. JENNINGS kept his horses steady while the rations were replaced and, regardless of danger, drove his wagon through the barrage.
